First Ever Visit of the Mill Hill Missionaries after 1977



After a lapse of over four decades, since the handing over of the College to Pakistan Army, the Revd. Fathers of the Mill Hill Mission once again stepped in the sanctuary of learning that was erected by them with great devotion and love in 1943.

On 3rd May, 2019, Revd. Father Richard Anguyo, a Mill Hill Missionary from Uganda, visited Army Burn Hall College for Boys. Bishop Humphrey Sarfaraz Peters helped materializing the visit, whereas Revd. Rafiq Javed and local Clergy hosted the visiting guest. A solemn ceremony was arranged in the honor of the revered personages. They were cordially received by the worthy Principal and senior faculty members. In the conference room, a briefing was given about the College History and the journey from its inception to the glory of excellence. The dignitaries were then led for a Grand Morning Assembly. The visit of the Campus rejoiced them even more as they witnessed the historic





infrastructure constructed in the times of MHM, and were delighted to see the preservation of the legacy. In the Scanlon Hall, the program commenced with the recitation of the Holy Quran followed by the introduction of the guests and recognition of the services of the Mill Hill Missionaries in the establishment of Army Burn Hall School. The venerated guest, Bishop Humphrey Sarfaraz Peters delivered a motivational lecture to the students, which indeed raised their spirits and enlightened the audience with special emphasis on the promotion of moral attributes. Anguyo also shared his treasured thoughts and briefly told about his own ministry and the current services of the Mill Hill Missionaries in Pakistan. He expressed his pleasure to be among the students and advised them to serve the Pakistani community after completing their studies. The students attentively listened to the distinguished speakers and participated in the question answers session.



In the end, the worthy Principal, Brig Wajid Qayyum Paracha extended his immense gratitude to the revered guests and presented them College souvenirs.

The contingent was then led to the Teachers Colony, where the Teachers' Colony Renovation Project was inaugurated by Bishop Humphrey Sarfaraz Peters and Revd. Richard Anguyo. Hvisit to Rise School Hbbottabad

On 9th April, 2019, nine students under the supervision of Miss Amira Emmanuel, Mr. Ummar Ali, and Mr.Muhammad Nisar visited Rise School (an institution for special children) Abbottabad with the purpose to hand over a donation of Rs. 0.1 million collected by the students. Rise School is a private institution that was established in 2013, with the objective to impart career oriented quality education and vocational training to special children. It is a matter of pride that two students of Rise School clinched gold medals in Special Olympics games held in 2015 & 2017. The Rise School is a project of Rise Welfare Organization which solely relies on donations provided by individuals and organizations. Presently 45 students, both boys and girls are enrolled in the school. During the visit, the contingent interacted with the Faculty and the students of Rise School. It was a unique and memorable experience that gave immense inspiration and motivation to the students and faculty to do something greater for the children with special needs. During interaction, the Principal of the School revealed that in our society special children are considered as burden and parents do not like to have their interaction with public. Visiting the special children and creating awareness about their needs can only help to uproot such taboos from our society.


